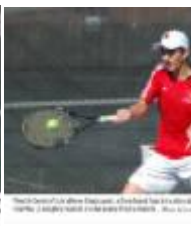
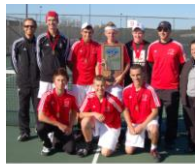
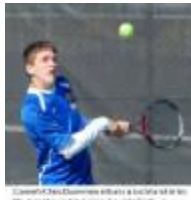


Hounded!

Carmel takes 2nd straight team title with 5-0 win over North Central

The Carmel High School boys' tennis team won its second consecutive IHSAA state team title on Saturday, defeating North Central 5-0 in a meeting between two of the iconic programs in the state. This was the first time the two schools had ever met in the championship match, thanks to the decision by the IHSAA to realign the tournament brackets. In fact, the two schools were joined in the final four by Center Grove and Park Tudor as metro area teams made up half of the "Eight at State" state finals round. At No. 1 singles, Mihir Kumar rebounded from his only loss of the season earlier in the day to defeat Riley Reist, 6-1, 6-3, while younger brother Sameer defeated Andrew Stutz, 6-2, 6-2. Chris Quammen took a 6-4, 6-2 decision at No. 3 singles over Ari Gerstein. In doubles, it was the No. 1 team of Elliott Yee and Connor Dunn winning 6-1, 6-0 over Jake Minner and Luke Lohrstorfer, while Charlie Emhardt and Patrick Farrell defeated Patrick McAuley and Will Reifeis, 6-2, 6-2 at No. 2. 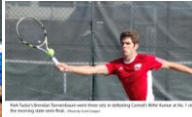
